ne of South Africa's national parks gained 2,345ha this month with the incorporation of a critical wetland, thanks to a partnership between SANParks and the World Wide Fund for Nature South Africa (WWF-SA). WWF-SA said a "generous donation" enabled it to take ownership of a farm called Soetendalsvlei last year, securing 90% of the wetland's vlei.

Soetendalsvlei, about 13km northwest of truisbaai in the Western Cape's Overberg region, is Africa's southernmost freshwater lake. With a surface area of 15.5km², it is the largest in the country that drains into the Indian Ocean. It is designated a Critical Biodiversity and Important Bird Area, supporting more than 60 waterbird species, including the damara tern, great white pelican and two flamingo species, with more than 21,000 migrant and resident birds that are recorded annually. The land also supports milkwood forests which once offered shelter to the first inhabitants of this area.

The vlei gets its name from the Zoetendaal, a Dutch ship that was wrecked off the nearby coast in 1673 en route from Jakarta, Indonesia. Survivors walked inland and found fresh water at the vlei to keep them alive.

Dr Luthando Dziba, SANParks managing executive: conservation services, said estuaries and wetlands are the most threatened and least protected ecosystems in South Africa and that the land added substantial value to the park's cultural and archaeological attributes. "Historically, people used the adjacent salt pans for harvesting salt for local use and later to export to Cape Town. About every 50 to 100 years the vlei's bed is exposed through droughts, such as happened in April 2019, when one could see some of these archaeological and cultural artefacts."

The park will begin clearing alien vegetation and addressing erosion, with the focus being on restoring the natural habitat. The newly expanded park is Africa's southernmost national park. Its name comes from the moniker 15th-century Portuguese navigators gave to the southernmost point of Africa. In English, it meant "Cape of Needles", inspired by the jagged reef and, some say, because it was one of the only places where true north and magnetic north (the compass needle) coincide.
